The Tobacco-Free Communities Program

Advocacy for policy changes that make tobacco products less visible, less accessible, and denormalize tobacco use.

- **10 businesses** adopted tobacco-free worksite policies
- 2 municipalities created tobacco-free grounds for parks or other properties
- 153 housing units in the Twin Counties became smoke-free
- 8 school districts received education for students, teachers and parents about the dangers of vaping

The Prescription Access & Referral Program

Helps qualified residents of Columbia, Greene, and northern Dutchess Counties to get their prescription medications at low or no cost. 144 people served





Helpers For Health Project

Begun in May 2019, this program helps Columbia and Greene County residents understand their health insurance benefits and how to use them, find healthcare providers, and schedule appointments. Helpers assist with arranging medical transportation, childcare, and interpretation services, and in setting health goals and making a plan to achieve those goals.


