

A Year in Review: 2021 A Report on Programs



The Children and Adults Rural Transportation Service (CARTS)

Door-to-door non-emergency medical transportation 487 clients served; 10,428 trips delivered; 206,080 miles travelled

The Navigator Program

In-person assistance enrolling in health insurance on the NY State of Health 1,370 inquiries answered; 1,044 applications completed; 1,159 people enrolled

NYConnects

Information, assistance and referral for individuals with long-term care needs ~ 356 people served

Independent Consumer Advocacy Network (ICAN)

Assistance and advocacy on behalf of residents of Columbia and Greene Counties with understanding how to enroll in and use managed care plans that cover long-term care services through Medicaid. The program ended April 30, 2021. Before it ended:

4 people served; 5 providers educated; 200 direct mailings to Columbia County residents receiving home-delivered meals; 220 direct mailings to Columbia and Greene Co. residents enrolled in Managed Long-Term Care



The Financial Assistance Funds

Financial support for health and other expenses for limited-resource individuals and families ~ 32 people assisted

The Prescription Access & Referral Program

Helps qualified residents of Columbia, Greene, and northern Dutchess Counties to get their prescription medications at low or no cost. ~ 64 people served



Tobacco-Free Action

Advocacy for policy measures that eliminate exposure to secondhand smoke, make tobacco products less visible, accessible and appealing, and denormalize tobacco use.

- Chatham Fairgrounds became the first NYS non-profit fairground to adopt a non-smoking policy. That policy prohibits smoking and vaping of both tobacco and cannabis.
- 1 municipality upgraded its smoking policy for all parks to include vaping
- 1 park extended its smoking policy to include nature trails and expanded recreation areas
- 3 municipalities upgraded park policies to include vaping and cannabis
- 1 municipality adopted a policy to prohibit smoking and vaping on all town property
- 41 new multi-unit smoke-free housing were created






