

# A Year in Review: 2022 A Report on Programs



## The Children and Adults Rural Transportation Service (CARTS)

Door-to-door non-emergency medical transportation

~521 clients served; 11,449 trips delivered; 227,490 miles travelled

## The Navigator Program

In-person assistance enrolling in health insurance on the NY State of Health ~1,529 inquiries answered; 1,075 applications completed; 1,235 ppl enrolled

#### **NYConnects**

Information, assistance and referral for individuals with long-term care needs ~ 360 people served

#### The Financial Assistance Funds

Financial support for health and other expenses for limited-resource individuals and families ~ 21 people assisted





# The Prescription Access & Referral Program

Help getting prescription medications at low or no cost for qualified residents of Columbia, Greene, and northern Dutchess Counties ~ 58 people served

#### **Tobacco-Free Action**

Advocacy for policy measures that eliminate exposure to secondhand smoke, make tobacco products less visible, accessible and appealing, and denormalize tobacco use

- The Village of Hunter passed a local law banning the sale of tobacco and vape products within 500 feet of the elementary school
- Ten businesses adopted a smoke-free grounds policy
- The **Town of Cairo and the Town of Windham** adopted policies prohibiting smoking and vaping in town parks and all other town property
- The Village of Coxsackie adopted a local law making all parks smoke and vape free
- Our Youth Coordinator conducted tobacco and vaping education at six school districts in Columbia and Greene Counties and co-facilitated "Harm Reduction Heroes" Peer Leadership training at the Mental Health Association's Youth Clubhouse



# Our ongoing role in the COVID-19 Response

During the pandemic, CARTS drivers continued to provide transportation services without interruption. Additionally, Consortium staff assisted residents in both Columbia and Greene Counties with vaccination registration efforts and, later, with ordering COVID-19 test kits.

832 vaccination registrations facilitated; 25 test kits ordered;
 191 informational phone calls answered
